**Kolkata Rape and Murder Case:** When the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) could not find out the truth of its interest even after 72 hours of long and tiring interrogation. Or it can also be said that the CBI has already found out the truth, but it wanted to hear it from the mouth of RG Kar Medical College Principal Dr. Sandeep Ghosh, but the Principal sahab did not open his mouth while being in his senses, so now it has resorted to a polygraph test. ## Permission granted to take a polygraph test

Along with this, the CBI feels that the four doctor friends who saw the trainee doctor alive for the last time that night and had dinner with her for the last time that night also know a lot that they should know, so the CBI is now preparing to conduct their polygraph test as well.

## Setback For Vijayasai's Daughter In High Court



YCP Rajya Sabha MP Vijayasai Reddy's daughter Neha Reddy faced a setback in the Andhra Pradesh High Court in connection with the case filed against her illegal construction near Bheemili beach in Visakhapatnam. The High Court has instructed the Greater Visakhapatnam Municipal Corporation (GVMC) to take action against the illegal construction of a compound wall at Bheemili Beach by Neha Reddy. The construction of this compound wall violates Coastal Regulation Zone (CRZ) regulations. The court also asked the GVMC officials to submit a detailed report regarding the action taken against the construction. Jana Sena corporator Murthy Yadav filed a Public Interest Litigation in the High Court, alleging that no action had been taken by officials despite the construction of illegal establishments near Bheemili beach. A bench consisting of Justice Dheeraj Singh Thakur and Justice Cheemalapati Ravi heard the case yesterday on Friday. Advocate Ponnada Srivyas argued on behalf of the petitioner and stated that GVMC officials gave permission to the illegal constructions near Bheemili Beach. He further mentioned that Neha Reddy challenged the petition by filing an appeal to a single judge. However, the judge did not issue any interim stay orders. After hearing the arguments, the bench stated that action should be taken against the construction if no interim stay was granted by the court. The next hearing has been postponed to September 11.

It is clear that in the rape-murder case of a lady doctor at Kolkata's RG Kar Medical College and Hospital, former principal Sandip Ghosh's troubles may increase immensely. Insiders are also saying that Dr. Sandip Ghosh may also be arrested by the CBI. Actually, Sandip Ghosh has been in the news ever since the case of rape and murder of a lady doctor in the hospital came to light. However, two days after the body of the trainee doctor was found in the seminar hall of the hospital on August 9, Sandip Ghosh resigned from the post of principal. But since then, he has been continuously facing questions from the central investigation agency.

## Sandeeep is facing questions from CBI

In the initial investigation of CBI, it became clear that only one person was involved in the rape and murder of the trainee doctor of RG Kar Hospital on the intervening night of 8th and 9th August. Sanjay Roy. But in the investigation of CBI till now, it has also become clear that after this incident came to light, the principal of RG Kar College, Dr. Sandeep Ghosh, deliberately tried his best to hush up the matter. But now did he do this effort in full consciousness, did he do it on someone's instructions, or is it the result of his negligence that he spoiled the scene of crime? CBI has to understand all this.



The investigating agency also wants to know whether pressure was also put on the police to be lax in this case? If yes, then why? To get to the bottom of such questions, CBI formally took permission from Sealdah Court for the polygraph test of Sandeep Ghosh.

## Dinner friends are also on the radar

However, CBI has already questioned all the four doctors in this connection apart from Dr. Sandeep Ghosh. But in this questioning, there are some important questions which did not get answers. Some answers were found but not the ones that were expected. Rather, such answers were found which tell a different story. That is when CBI started feeling that the truth is something else but what is being shown and told is something else. That means these people are somehow hesitating to tell things related to the case openly. Hence, the entire ground for conducting a polygraph test was prepared. Because this

is a scientific method which is accepted by the court also and no one is harmed in this.

## Searching for food in every way

While battling the questions of CBI for seven consecutive days, Sandeep Ghosh has given many answers. His car has also been searched and investigation is going on. All the records of the hospital are being scrutinized. But CBI did not get anything to its liking. CBI is trying to understand whether Dr. Ghosh misused his car to destroy evidence. Whether he had any role in bringing or hiding any goods. Obviously, there is an attempt to hide something in this case, that is why CBI is resorting to this technique.

What a strange coincidence that Sandeep Ghosh, who became the principal of the same medical college from where he studied, is now facing questions for the crime committed in the same medical college. Whether these days will change or he has to see even worse days, it is only a matter of time.

## 'Close ties with government, picking up college girls': Shocking allegations against leading actor

THIRUVANANTHAPURAM: Financial expert and teacher Mary George has made serious allegations against a prominent Malayalam actor, accusing him of luring young women from Thiruvananthapuram Women's College in the 1980s with promises of film roles. In a recent media interview, Mary George revealed that the actor, who had significant connections with the government, would regularly pick up young women in his expensive car from outside the college gates. Mary George stated that this issue was brought to her attention by fellow teachers, who recently disclosed their

concerns to her. She added that had she been aware of this at the time, she would have intervened. According to her, the actor would arrive daily in an expensive car and wait outside the college gate, where some girls would then get into the vehicle. Teachers became aware of this behaviour through the students and began closely monitoring the situation. Once the teachers confirmed the truth of the incidents, they reported it to the principal. The principal observed the actor's actions and identified which girls were involved, but despite this, she felt powerless to intervene. After attempting to address



the situation but realizing it was futile, the principal advised her colleagues not to interfere further. Mary George also noted that the actor in question remains active in the film industry to this day.

## Amazon Employee Admits Earning Rs 3 Crore For Doing 'Almost Nothing'

In today's job market, success often hinges on achieving work goals and securing a strong compensation package. However, this wasn't the case for a senior Amazon employee who, despite earning around Rs 3 crore, found himself doing almost nothing. He shared his story on Blind, an anonymous professional community, where people discuss workplace experiences. After being laid off from Google, he landed a role at Amazon as a Senior Technical Program Manager, with a total compensation of \$370,000 (approximately Rs 3 crore). Interestingly, he admitted to joining Amazon with the intention of doing "nothing" and earning easy money—and that's exactly what happened. "I joined Amazon 1.5 years ago after I was included in Google's layoff. I joined with the intention of doing "nothing," getting free money, and eventually getting pip'd. I put in about 8 hours a week, mostly in meetings. Without exaggeration, I owned 0 kingpin goals (Amazon goal process), resolved 7 tickets, and deliv-



ered 1 automated dashboard that I built using ChatGPT in 3 days (but said it took 3 months)," he revealed. The employee went on to boast that his typical 8-hour workday mostly consists of turning down requests from other teams looking to integrate with his department or making them do over 95 per cent of the work themselves. His post quickly went viral, sparking a wide range of reactions. While many criticised his approach, others found it appealing. One user commented, "People who tie their self-esteem and purpose to

their corporate job are completely wrong. A person working 2 hours a day, getting paid for 8, and having all that time for their private lives, family, and hobbies is winning at life." Another commented, "There is more to life than scamming people and abusing their trust." "People that are butthurt about this: 99% of you corporate peons are useless and in denial. If you work a lot, you are either just inefficient or keeping yourself busy with random BS. If you genuinely believe you should work 8-10h per day you drank the corporate kool-aid," another comment read. One of the comments read, "These people are ruining the game for everyone else that actually wants to work and earn an honest day's work." A user asserted why tech companies brought layoffs and wrote, "People like this are the reasons why the tech bro layoffs happened. Not even kidding they're paid way too much to do nothing." Reshared on the X platform, the tweet has garnered over 3 million views.
