

AAP made a big announcement about the Delhi Assembly elections, Congress in shock!



The results of Haryana and Jammu and Kashmir assembly elections were declared on Tuesday. AAP announced to contest Delhi elections alone

Aam Aadmi Party's national spokesperson Priyanka Kakkar has clearly stated that the party will contest the upcoming Delhi Assembly elections alone. Priyanka Kakkar called the Congress overconfident and said that the Congress did not perform well in this election due to its overconfidence. Kejriwal's statement: Avoid overconfidence

Kejriwal said, "The election results in Haryana show that no one should take elections lightly. Every election and every seat is challenging." Preparation for Delhi Assembly elections

The next assembly elections in Delhi are expected in early 2025. In the 2020 assembly elections, the Aam Aadmi Party won 62 out of 70 seats, while the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) won 8 seats. Congress did not even open its account in that election. Apart from this, in the recently held Lok Sabha elections 2024, the BJP won all 7 Lok Sabha seats in Delhi.

Congress crisis

After this defeat of Congress, the situation of the party is becoming serious. The disappointing performance in these elections has indicated that Congress needs to improve its strategies. After being targeted by other parties of the INDI Alliance, Congress will now have to take concrete steps to maintain its credibility.

Strategy for the next elections

Ratan Tata Once Defended a Woman Who Trolled Him on Instagram With 'Chhotu' Jibe

Ratan Tata, the former chairman of Tata Sons, is no longer with us, but his humility and simplicity will live on in the hearts of those who knew him. Tata, who passed away on October 9 at the age of 86 at Mumbai's Breach Candy Hospital, once found himself defending a "young woman" who called him "chhotu" on Instagram. After a long absence from public life, Ratan Tata joined Instagram in 2019. He shared a post announcing the same on October 30: "I don't know about breaking the Internet, but I am so excited to join all of you on Instagram! After a long absence from public life, I look forward to exchanging stories and creating something special with such a diverse community!" Just a few months later, Tata's follower count on Instagram reached one million. In February 2020, he celebrated the milestone with a post on "gram" - Ratan Tata's own casual way of referring to Instagram. He wrote, "I've just seen that the number of people on this page has reached a milestone. This wonderful online family is not what I expected when I joined



Instagram and I have you to thank for it. "I do believe that the quality of connections you make in this age of the internet is far greater than any number," he continued. He further said, "Being a part of your community and learning from you is truly exciting and makes me very happy and I hope our journey together continues." Tata completed his post with a picture of himself sitting on the floor, legs crossed, with a contented smile. While many congratulated Tata on reaching one million followers, others praised him for his simplicity. Amid these barrage of comments, one particular comment drew attention. A woman while congratulating Tata trolled him as "chhotu". She wrote, "Congratula-

tions Chhotu," with a heart emoji. Many bashed her left and right for referring to the industrialist as "chhotu", so much so, that Tata himself had to defend the woman. The Padma awardee urged people to treat the woman with "respect". He wrote, "There is a child in each one of us. Please treat this young lady with respect." Sadly, the woman ended up deleting her comment after being subjected to bullying by faceless trolls. When Tata learned of this, he addressed it through his Instagram stories, condemning the harsh treatment she faced. Tata posted a series of three Instagram stories, beginning with, "A very innocent young lady expressed her heartfelt sentiments yesterday and called me a 'kid' in one of her comments. "She was bullied and disrespected for this, and in the end she deleted her sentiments," he wrote in his second story. He further expressed, "I appreciate and respect the heartfelt note that the young lady had left me, and hope she will not refrain from posting again."

Mortal Remains Kept at NCPA in Mumbai, Funeral at Worli Crematorium

The mortal remains of the legendary industrialist Ratan Tata were kept at the National Centre for Performing Arts (NCPA) in Mumbai Marine Drive for public view and to pay their last respects to the Mumbai-based businessman from 10.30 am till 4 pm on Thursday, October 10. Ratan Tata passed away on Wednesday evening (October 9) in Mumbai's Breach Candy Hospital. He was 86. According to a statement from Tata Trust, the mortal remains will be taken on its final journey at 4 pm.

Mortal Remains of Ratan Tata Brought at NCPA

"We will request the members of the public to enter NCPA Lawns from Gate 3 and the exit will be at Gate 2. There will be no parking available at the premises. At 4 pm, the mortal remains will embark on its final journey to the Prayer Hall at the Worli Crematorium, Dr E Moses Road, Worli for the final rites," the release read. Marine Drive is closed beyond the Oberoi Hotel. The Police have cordoned off the road leading to NCPA Lawns. Ratan Tata's Mortal Remains to Be Kept at NCPA. Union Home Minister Amit Shah arrived in Mumbai to represent the Government of India at his last rites. He will pay his last respects to the icon in Mumbai. Maharashtra Chief Minister Eknath Shinde has said that the last rites will be performed with full state honours. Maharashtra CMO office said that the government has declared one day of mourning in the wake of Ratan Tata's death. No state celebrations will take place today. "All government buildings will have the national flag at half-mast and no cultural or entertainment programme of the government will be held today. Ratan Tata's funeral will be conducted with all state honours," the CMO Maharashtra said. Aditya Birla group chairman Kumar Mangalam Birla said, "It's a great loss for the country - not just for corporate India but the country as a whole. The impact of his work is quite unparalleled. We should remember him through the richness of his work. We met many times, years back - he was sober, frugal and always used to think in the interest of the country." RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das said, "There are



two things that stand out about Shri Ratan Tata. First, he was a true visionary. Second, he was a strong believer in ethics in corporate governance. I think whenever the economic history of modern India is written, I would feel that a full volume will not be enough to describe his achievements... A great son of India and a phenomenal person. May his soul rest in peace." NCP-SCP chief Sharad Pawar, with her daughter and MP from Baramati Supriya Sule, paid her last respects to Ratan Tata at NCPA grounds in Mumbai. Maharashtra Deputy CM Ajit Pawar and NCP working president Praful Patel also paid their last respects to Ratan Tata at NCPA lawns in Mumbai.

Ex-Lover Simi Garewal Pens Emotional Farewell, Says 'It's Too Hard To...'

Simi Garewal, who once admitted to dating Ratan Tata, has shared a heartfelt tribute following the iconic industrialist's passing. Ratan Tata, the former chairman of Tata Sons and a beloved philanthropist, passed away at the age of 86 on Wednesday. He had been admitted to Mumbai's Breach Candy Hospital on Monday after suffering a sudden drop in blood pressure and was in critical condition in the ICU. In her emotional tribute, Simi took to social media to express her grief, sharing a nostalgic photo of herself with Tata from her iconic talk show *Rendezvous* with Simi Garewal. Alongside the throwback picture, she wrote, "They say you have gone.. It's too hard to bear your loss..too hard.. Farewell my friend.. #RatanTata." Simi Garewal had



opened up about her relationship with Ratan Tata in a 2011 interview. She described their bond, saying, "Ratan and I go back a long way. He's perfection, he's got a sense of humour, is modest, and the perfect gentleman. Money was never his driving force. He's not as relaxed in India as he is abroad." Despite their connection, their romance did not

last, and Simi later married someone else. However, they remained close friends over the years. Ratan Tata, widely admired for his work ethic, humility, and generosity, never married nor had any children, despite coming close several times. He previously revealed in an interview that he had been in love on four occasions but never followed through with marriage due to various reasons. One of his most serious relationships was in the early 1960s while working in the US, but circumstances, including the 1962 Indo-China War, prevented it from moving forward. Tata's passing has left a deep void, with countless tributes pouring in for the industrialist who shaped India's corporate landscape and touched lives far beyond the boardroom.
