











## Promised 20 Lakhs, Paid Only Rs 1 Lakh, Hitman Goes To Cops In UP

A year-old murder case has been re-opened in Uttar Pradesh's Meerut after a hired killer, who is out on bail, approached the police for not being paid a ransom for the job, officials said on Friday. According to the police, the contract killer, Neeraj Sharma, was promised Rs 20 lakh by the conspirators to kill a lawyer, Anjali Garg last year, but now they have gone back on their word. On June 7, 2023, Anjali, a resident of Umesh Vihar Colony of TP Nagar police station in Meerut, was shot dead by two people while she was returning home from a dairy. The police had initially taken the victim's divorced husband and in-laws

into custody as they were engaged in a property dispute. However, they were later released. According to officials, the victim was living in the house which was under her ex-husband, Nitin Gupta's name. Her in-laws later sold the property to Yashpal and Suresh Bhatia, but the victim was not ready to vacate the house - resulting in a dispute. A few days into the murder, it was revealed the property buyers had hired Sharma and two others to kill Anjali over a contract of Rs two lakhs. Five people, including Yashpal, Bhatia, Sharma, and the two killers who shot Anjali, were arrested. Now, over a year later, Sharma - who was released on bail - revealed that

the victim's in-laws and husband were also involved in the killing. The in-laws had promised a ransom of Rs 20 lakhs and had given Rs one lakh as an advance, he told the police. Sharma could not take the remaining Rs 19 lakh due to his arrest. However, now being out of jail, he approached the victim's in-laws for the remaining amount, but they refused it, Sharma said. According to the accused-turned-complainant, the police should take action and register a case against the victim's in-laws. He has also provided call recordings with the in-laws as a piece of evidence, the police said.

## India to have its own navigation system for citizens, Isro to launch 7 NaVIC satellites



The Indian Space Research Organisation (Isro) announced that it is working to make India's own regional navigation system (NaVIC) which will be accessible to civilians soon. As of now, the accurate positioning system is confined to only strategic use. Pawan Goenka, chairman of space regulator and promoter INSPACe noted that "by 2025, Isro will target to launch a dozen satellites every year, including six GSLV launches," The Times of India reported. He said that satellite launches will be ramped up to fulfil the

growing demand of the space sector. "We are introducing seven navigation satellites with a new L1 band that will make NaVIC signals accessible in civilians' mobile phones with a compact chipset. Of the seven, one satellite has already been launched. Navigation satellites launched earlier worked on different bands (L5 and S)," Goenka said during a media roundtable. He maintained that NaVIC (Navigation With Indian Constellation) is more accurate than navigation systems around the world and that the Indian government is working on widening its reach, TOI reported. INSPACe planning to bring space law into the country. During the presser, Goenka maintained that the formation of INSPACe, space policy

and FDI has provided a major boost to the sector. "Our next objective is to bring in space law, which the country doesn't have," he added. "We have prepared the first draft and will send it for consultation and then it will go to the ministry for clearance before cabinet approval. The entire process will be completed by either end of this year or by the first quarter of next year," Goenka said. It is pertinent to note that NaVIC provides positioning accuracy of better than 10 metres throughout India and better than 20 metres for the area surrounding India by 1,500 km. Goenka also informed that Isro is planning to focus on small launchers and satellites so that it can grab a lion's share of the \$5.2 billion global small satellite market. With this aim in mind, Isro has developed a mini-launcher SSLV and Goenka noted that its technology will be transferred to the private sector in the next two years.

## 'Never Allow Yourself To Be Compromised'



New Delhi: In a moving farewell speech at an event organized by the Supreme Court Bar Association, outgoing Chief Justice of India (CJI) DY Chandrachud shared a personal story about his father's advice on integrity. His father, the late YV Chandrachud, who was also a former Chief Justice and India's longest-serving CJI, bought a modest flat in Pune with a powerful message in mind. The elder Chandrachud urged his son to keep the flat until the end of his judicial career, emphasizing that having this home would provide a sense of security to help him uphold moral and intellectual integrity throughout his life. Justice Chandrachud recounted his conversation with his father, saying he questioned why the flat was purchased in Pune, a city they rarely visited. His father explained that while he might never live in the flat himself, it was intended as a reminder that if at any point his son felt pressured to compromise his values as a lawyer or judge, he should remember he always had a 'roof over his head.' His father's

message was clear, that the assurance of a secure home could empower him to make decisions grounded in integrity, free from external influences or pressures. While addressing his farewell function, Chief Justice of India DY Chandrachud said "He (my father) bought this small flat in Pune. I asked him, why are you buying a flat in Pune? When are we going to go and stay there? He said, I know I'm never going to stay there. He said I'm not sure how long I will be with you. But do one thing, keep this flat until the last day of your tenure as a judge. I said, why is that? He said, if you feel that your moral integrity or your intellectual integrity is ever compromised, I

want you to know that you have a roof over your head. Never allow yourself to be compromised either as a lawyer or as a judge because you have no place of your own..." CJI DY Chandrachud Retires Today; Here Are 10 Pivotal Judgments Made By Former Chief Justice Of India This story surrounds around late YV Chandrachud's wisdom, reinforcing the importance of integrity in the judicial profession and in life. ## If India goes to war with Pakistan, how long will it take to reach fighter jets?



The relationship between India and Pakistan has always been tense. In such a situation, the question often arises that if there is a conflict, how quickly can the fighter planes of the Indian Air Force reach the Pakistani border.

### Strength of Indian air force

The Indian Air Force is considered one of the most powerful forces in the world. It has a variety of modern fighter aircraft, including Sukhoi-30MKI, Mirage-2000 and indigenous Tejas. All these aircraft are equipped with state-of-the-art technology and weapons, which give them the unique ability to quickly enter and attack enemy territory. Apart from this, these aircraft are also equipped with advanced sensors, which help them to accurately target enemy targets.

### Time to reach Pakistan border

Now the question is how long it takes for Indian fighter jets to reach the Pakistani border. The answer depends on many factors. Every aircraft has different speed and range, which affects its flight speed and distance. For example, Sukhoi-30MKI is an aircraft that can fly at a faster speed than Mirage-2000. Therefore, Sukhoi-30MKI can reach the border faster.

Apart from this, the flight route also affects this time. Flying in a straight line is the fastest, but for safety and to avoid the enemy's air defense system, the pilot has to use curved routes. In such a case, the time to reach may increase slightly. At the same time, the fuel capacity of the aircraft also plays an important role. If the aircraft has to remain in enemy territory for a long time, then the fuel capacity will determine its flight distance.

### On the Pakistani border in a few minutes

Usually, the fighter planes of the Indian Air Force can reach the Pakistani border in a few minutes due to their high speed. These planes fly so fast that they have the ability to respond immediately to any emergency in the border areas. This fast and precise attitude of the Air Force helps it play an important role in the security of the Indian border. The power and preparedness of the Indian Air Force is a strong message to the enemies. The Indian Air Force planes equipped with modern weapons and technology can take immediate action in any emergency. If any conflict situation arises with Pakistan, Indian fighter planes can reach the border quickly and ensure the security of Indian interests.

## Global oil prices would have hit the roof if India had not bought oil from Russia: Hardeep Singh Puri



Global oil prices "would have hit the roof" if big importer India had not bought oil from Russia following the Ukraine war, India's oil minister said, adding that prices would determine where the country buys oil from. India, the world's third largest oil importer and consumer, has become the top buyer of discounted Russian sea-borne oil shunned by Western countries since Ukraine's invasion began in early 2022. Before that, India bought little oil from its long-running defence partner, Russia. New Delhi has repeatedly defended its purchases from Russia as necessary to keep prices in check in the developing country of 1.42 billion people. "What many around the world don't seem to realize is that global oil prices would have hit the roof if India had not bought oil from Russia," India's oil minister, Hardeep Singh Puri, wrote on X late on Friday. "We owe it to our citizens - India will buy oil from wherever our companies get the best rates." India's crude oil imports from Russia rose by 11.7% to about 1.9 million barrels per day in September, accounting for about two-fifths of the South Asian nation's overall crude imports in the month. Russia was followed by Iraq and Saudi Arabia as India's biggest suppliers.

## Gujarat family spends Rs 4 lakh on burial ceremony for 'lucky' Wagnor car; 1,500 people attend



Amreli: A farmer's family in Gujarat's Amreli district has become the talk of the town after they held a grand burial event for their "lucky" car. Nearly 1,500 people, including seers and spiritual leaders, attended the function organised by Sanjay Polara and his family at Padarshinga village of Lathi taluka on Thursday. A video of the event that went viral on social media shows Polara and his family performing rituals at their farm, where a slope and 15-foot deep pit was dug for their 12-year-old Wagon R. The hatchback, decorated with flowers and garlands, was taken to Polara's farm from his house with much fanfare, driven on the slope and placed in the pit. The vehicle was covered with a green cloth, and the family members bid farewell by performing puja and showering rose petals as priests chanted mantras. Finally, an excavator machine was used to pour clay and bury the car.

### Family's lucky car

Polara, who has a construction business in Surat, said he wanted to do something different so that future generations remember the car that proved lucky for the family. Talking to reporters, Polara said, "I bought this car nearly 12 years ago, and it brought prosperity to the family. Apart from seeing success in business, my family also gained respect. The vehicle proved lucky for my family and me. Hence, instead of selling it, I gave it a samadhi at my farm as a tribute." Polara, who spent Rs 4 lakh on the ceremony, said he plans to plant a tree at the burial place as a reminder for his future generations that the family's lucky car is lying under the tree. The samadhi ceremony was held as per Hindu rituals and in the presence of seers and religious leaders. Nearly 1,500 people were invited, and a feast was organised.



## Rs 3.7 crore cash seized from van in Palghar amid Maharashtra poll code

Police have seized more than Rs 3.70 crore cash from a van in Palghar district of Maharashtra amid the code of conduct in place for the November 20 assembly polls. The cash was seized on Friday. According to officials, the vehicle was en route from Airoli, Navi Mumbai, to Wada, Vikramgarh. The company that owns the car claimed that the cash was intended for ATM refills. However, the driver was unable to provide the required documentation to support this claim. Police inspector Datta Kindre said, "The police's vigilance and flying squad received a tip-off that a van was transporting cash through the district. Based on the information, the team intercepted the van and carried out a check, during which it found that Rs 3,70,50,000 cash was being transported. The driver and security personnel failed to produce valid documents required for the transportation of the cash". The police official added that the driver and security personnel told the police that the cash was being taken from a company based in Navi Mumbai to Vikramgad in Palghar. The cash has since been seized and the Income Tax Department as well as election officials have been informed for further probe, he said, adding that two occupants of the van have been detained.

## Karnataka Horror: Teacher Molested & Buried Alive - The Yoga Skills That Saved Her

Chikkaballapur: A shocking incident has surfaced in Karnataka's Chikkaballapur, where a yoga trainer was buried alive in a deserted area after she was kidnapped, molested by a detective agency owner and his associates at gunpoint. According to the police, the accused abducted the victim, attacked her and buried her alive assuming she was dead. However, the 34-year-old yoga trainer used her yoga techniques to fake her death and managed to escape from the spot after all the accused fled. The victim later reached the Chikkaballapur police and narrated the entire ordeal. Based on the statement, the police registered a case and arrested the owner of the detective agency, Satish Reddy, and his three associates along with a woman, identified as Bindu, for allegedly kidnapping the yoga trainer at gunpoint and attempting to murder her on October 24. During the investigation, the cops found that the accused first stole a vehicle from the Koppal area and used it in the commission of the crime. Police Recovered Stolen Vehicle, Jewellery From The Accused Confirming the incident, a senior police official said, "Bindu suspected her husband of having an affair with

the Yoga teacher and asked her friend, Satish Reddy, who runs a detective agency in Bengaluru, to keep a tab on the woman and her proximity to him. As part of the plan, Reddy allegedly befriended the victim some three months ago on the pretext of taking yoga classes from her and during this period, he managed to gain her confidence. In her complaint, the victim stated that on the pretext of showing some places around the city on October 23, Reddy came to her house near Dibburahalli and took her in a car in which three other men were also present. Further she alleged that they took her to a secluded spot on the outskirts of the city and allegedly stripped and assaulted her. The accused allegedly thrashed, threatened and strangled using a cable. She claimed that she played along, pretended to be unconscious and faked her death using breathing techniques. Assuming the woman died, the accused allegedly dug a pit and covered her body with thin layers of soil because they were in a hurry and feared to be caught. But before leaving, they took away all her gold jewellery," a senior police officer said. She claimed that she later managed to come out of the



pit and with the help of some villagers, got clothes and managed to reach the police station to file a complaint, he said. The woman was sent for a medical examination and admitted to a hospital. "Based on the complaint, we registered a case under sections of kidnapping, attempt to murder and other appropriate sections of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita. Based on the investigation, we arrested five people, including Reddy and Bindu, on November 6," the police officer said. The vehicle in which the victim was kidnapped was allegedly stolen from Bengaluru, police said, adding, the victim's jewellery has also been recovered with the arrests. "We are trying to verify all the claims made by the victim. There were also some online money transactions between Bindu and the associates and we are investigating the money trail also," the police further added.
