

12 years in America... couldn't find a job in India

After spending over a decade in the United States, an Indian software developer with a master's degree from the University of Michigan is facing challenges in securing employment within India's IT sector. Despite his extensive experience as a full-stack developer, his lack of familiarity with the latest cloud technologies such as Docker and Kubernetes is proving to be a significant barrier. The decision to move back to India was driven by his desire to be closer to his aging parents and to provide care for his unwell mother. Despite his efforts over the last six months, only one

job interview has come his way, which did not result in employment. The developer's struggle was brought to light on a Reddit post, garnering empathy and advice from the online community. The consensus among commenters was that there is a clear need for him to update his skill set to align with current IT industry requirements. Suggestions ranged from taking on freelance projects and seeking remote work opportunities to leveraging networks within Indian technology firms and considering employment at startups. Some even recommended he explore the possi-

bility of transferring to his American employer's Indian branch or reconnect with former colleagues to improve his job prospects. Experts in the career field echo the sentiment that staying abreast of technological advancements and actively expanding professional networks is essential for enhancing employability in India's competitive IT landscape. They emphasize the importance of adaptability and continuous learning as key to overcoming such hurdles. The advice to engage more deeply with the industry through various means highlights a pathway forward for the engi-

neer, suggesting that with the right strategies, he can bridge the gap between his current skills and the demands of the job market. Despite the setbacks, the support from the Reddit community underscores the value of the developer's prior experience and suggests a hopeful outlook for his career transition back to India. By focusing on skill development and networking, he can navigate the challenges of re-entering the Indian IT industry and secure a position that leverages his extensive background in software development.

"USCIS Targets OPT Students Amid Fraud Crackdown, Risk of Deportation"



In a recent development, former international students in the United States, particularly those engaged in Optional Practical Training (OPT) programs or currently employed, are facing severe challenges due to a shift in policy enforcement by the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS). A new directive, known as the 'Issue of Notice to Appear' policy by the USCIS, has put these students at risk of deportation. This initiative, part of the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), involves the issuance of notices based on undisclosed fraud investigations, potentially leading to arrest and detention. Students are being clandestinely accused of fraud related to the OPT program, marking a significant escalation in the scrutiny of international students' employment practices. The crux of the issue lies in the operation of certain companies that target recent graduates for consulting positions, specifically aiming at those holding OPT status. These entities offer employment that purportedly requires further training, for which the students are charged. Unfortunately, the quality of this training is subpar, and often, the promised projects that are crucial for fulfilling the OPT's work experience criteria are non-existent. Consequently, students find themselves in a predicament where their professional engagements are merely nominal, forcing them to pursue part-time jobs elsewhere to support themselves. This deceptive practice not only undermines the integrity of the OPT program but also places the affected students in a precarious position with immigration authorities. Despite the lack of public warnings from the DHS about these fraudulent schemes, actions are being taken against the companies involved. Through raids and investigations, DHS is collecting information on employees, including students enrolled in the OPT program. This data is then cross-referenced with existing records to identify individuals potentially involved in these scams. This secretive approach by the DHS and USCIS in labeling students as fraudsters without their knowledge has led to heightened anxiety and uncertainty among the international student community. Given these alarming circumstances, immigration analysts are urging the affected students to proactively seek legal assistance. They recommend that students approach USCIS to clarify their situations and, if possible, have their names removed from the implicated lists through a legal process. This advice underscores the importance of addressing the issue head-on, as ignoring the situation could result in severe legal and immigration consequences. In light of these developments, it's clear that international students, particularly those from India, who are pursuing or have completed their OPT in the U.S., are navigating a precarious landscape. With the DHS and USCIS intensifying their efforts to clamp down on OPT-related fraud, the need for vigilance and proactive measures has never been more critical. The community is encouraged to stay informed and seek reputable legal guidance to navigate these challenges effectively.

India Introduces New Passport Rules for Birth Proof and Documentation

The Indian government has introduced changes to the passport application process, mandating that individuals born after September 30, 2023, exclusively use their birth certificate as proof of date of birth. This certificate must be issued by an authorized body such as the Registrar of Births and Deaths or the Municipal Corporation. This is part of the recent amendments to the Passport Rules of 1980, detailed in a notification released earlier this week. The revised regulations are set to be implemented following their publication in the official gazette. For those born before October 1, 2023, a variety of documents can serve as proof of birth. These include not only the birth certificate from a recognized authority but also other documents like a transfer or school leaving certificate, a policy bond from life insurance corporations, and even a driving license, among others. For government employees or retirees, an extract from their service record or pension order, appropriately attested, is acceptable. Additionally, Aadhaar Cards, PAN Cards, and Election Photo Identity Cards are among the documents

that the Indian government accepts as proof of date of birth for passport applications. Apart from proving one's date of birth, applicants must also provide proof of address. This can be done through utility bills such as water or electricity bills, income tax assessment orders, or even a spouse's passport copy, provided it includes the applicant's name and the addresses match. For minors, a parent's passport copy can be submitted. Moreover, a declaration from the head of an orphanage or child care home is valid for those without standard proof of date of birth. The use of an Aadhaar Card is encouraged as it can speed up the passport application process. The process of obtaining an Indian passport requires applicants to submit specific documents to verify both their date of birth and address. For individuals applying for a passport who were born on or before September 30, 2023, the list of acceptable documents is extensive. It includes educational certificates, insurance policy documents, government service records, and various identity cards issued by state and central



government bodies. For proof of address, documents like a rent agreement, bank account passbook, and certificates from employers of reputed companies are valid. This update to the Passport Rules of 1980 signifies the Indian government's effort to streamline the passport application process and ensure the authenticity of applicants' information. By requiring a birth certificate for those born after a certain date and providing a comprehensive list of alternative documents for others, the government aims to facilitate a smoother application process while maintaining security and verification standards.

Father Kills Daughter Over Love Affair in Anantapur Tragedy

On March 1, in a harrowing incident that shook the Kasapuram village of Anantapur, T Ramanjaneyulu, a 55-year-old man, took the life of his 20-year-old daughter, T Bharati, in a brutal act sparked by her love affair. Police reports reveal that Ramanjaneyulu, unable to accept his daughter's relationship, resorted to hanging her in an isolated location around 1 pm. To further conceal the crime, he drenched her body in petrol and set it on fire, aiming for complete immolation. This act of violence highlights the extreme measures taken by a father against his daughter's defiance and love life. The tragedy unfolds further details about Bharati and her relationship. Described as deeply in love, Bharati had been with her boyfriend for five years, a relationship that faced strong opposition from both families. Despite the disapproval, Bharati, who was pursuing her graduation in Kurnool, and her boyfriend, a fellow student in



Hyderabad, continued their relationship. Bharati's commitment to her love was so profound that she had once threatened to end her life over it. Her refusal to end the affair and her threats of suicide reportedly pushed her father over the edge, leading to the fateful day in Kasapuram. Bharati's background paints a picture of a young woman with promise and expectations placed upon her. Among four daughters, she stood out as the only one who pursued higher education. Her parents, especially her father, had high hopes for her future, seeing her education as a beacon of success for

the family. Unfortunately, her aspirations and her family's dreams were cut short in the most tragic manner. In the aftermath of Bharati's death, Ramanjaneyulu surrendered to the authorities, prompting police action. The police are now proceeding with legal actions against him under BNS Section 103, signifying the gravity of the crime committed. This incident not only sheds light on the fatal consequences of familial disputes over personal choices but also underscores the societal pressures and expectations that can lead to such extreme outcomes. Rising Costs Prompt Reconsideration of Military Aircraft for Deportations



Amid increasing costs, U.S. President Donald Trump's strict policies on deporting illegal immigrants using military aircraft are being reconsidered. It has been reported that sending migrants back to their countries on these planes is significantly more expensive compared to other methods. Officials are now questioning the necessity of employing combat aircraft for these operations, pointing towards the financial strain it places on the country's budget. The practice of deporting illegal immigrants on special planes has led to a considerable financial burden, as highlighted by recent reports. The U.S. has been actively transporting individuals back to nations like Guatemala, Peru, and Honduras, among others. However, the expense involved in using military aircraft for these operations is becoming a point of concern. While ICE chartered aircraft operate at a cost of \$17,000 per hour, translating to about \$630 per person, the expenditure for military planes, specifically the C-17, escalates to \$28,500 per hour. This significant increase in costs is prompting officials to reconsider the use of combat aircraft for future deportations. No planes are currently scheduled for this purpose, following a deportation flight that took place on March 1. Officials suggest that the pause in utilizing military planes for deporting illegal immigrants could either be extended or become a permanent decision. As the debate over the financial implications of using military aircraft continues, it has come to light that the costs mentioned are solely for flights to Guatemala. Should these operations extend to other countries, such as India, the expenses would rise even further. To date, Indian migrants have been deported on three occasions using these costly methods. This situation underscores the need for a reassessment of the deportation strategy, particularly in terms of its economic viability. In conclusion, the U.S. is at a crossroads concerning its approach to deporting illegal immigrants. The high costs associated with using military planes for these operations are leading to a reevaluation of their necessity. As officials weigh the financial implications against the intended outcomes, the future of this deportation method remains uncertain.

Five Arrested in \$237K LCBO Theft Operation in Ontario



Investigators in Ontario, Canada, have apprehended five men linked to a significant theft operation targeting the Liquor Control Board of Ontario (LCBO). This crime ring is accused of orchestrating thefts at 50 LCBO outlets from August 2024 to February 2025, accumulating stolen goods valued at an impressive \$237,738.95. The individuals, caught on surveillance, are believed to be in their twenties. However, the police have yet to disclose the specific amounts stolen by each person. The method of operation involved a few members distracting the


staff while others slipped into restricted areas to pilfer bottles of liquor, showcasing a high level of coordination and planning. The individuals charged in connection with these thefts are Anuj Kumar, 25;

Simarpeet Singh, 29; Sharandeep Singh, 25; Simranjeet Singh, 24, who is also facing a charge for Breach of Release Order; and Prabhpreet Singh, 29, from Caledon, charged with Break and Enter. Each of them faces a charge of Theft Over \$5000, and three among them have additional charges for break-and-enter and conspiring to commit an indictable offence. This operation stands out for targeting liquor, a less common objective in large-scale heists, indicating a unique approach by the perpetrators. The investigation remains active, with

two more suspects, Jagshir Singh, 28, and Punit Sehra, 25, still at large. Police are determined to continue their efforts until all involved are held accountable. Deputy Chief Marc Andrews of the Peel Regional Police lauded the investigative work, stating, "These arrests send a strong message to criminals." The involvement of young individuals in such an extensive criminal endeavor has taken many by surprise, underlining the determined efforts by law enforcement to tackle and dismantle organized theft rings effectively. The extensive nature of the theft, involving multiple locations and a significant amount of stolen liquor, highlights the sophistication and coordination among the individuals involved.
