

Modi Meets President, Reviews Counter-Terror Mission



Prime Minister Narendra Modi met President Droupadi Murmu at Rashtrapati Bhavan to brief her on the precision military strikes carried out under Operation Sindoos. The strikes, executed early Wednesday morning, targeted nine terror sites in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK), including key headquarters and training centres of terrorist outfits Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) and Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM). These strikes came two weeks after the deadly terror attack in Pahalgam, Jammu and Kashmir, which claimed the lives of 26 civilians, including one Nepali national. "Prime Minister Shri @narendramodi called on President Droupadi Murmu at Rashtrapati Bhavan and briefed her about Operation Sindoos," the president's office wrote in a post on X, confirming the encounter. Pictures of the exchange were also made public. Prime Minister Modi has also delayed his planned trip to Europe due to the heightened tensions between India and Pakistan at the moment. In addition to attending the Nordic Summit in Norway from May 13-17, the planned itinerary included stops in Croatia, Norway, and the Netherlands, according to official sources.

'Indian Strikes an Act of War': Shehbaz Sharif Warns of Strong Response

Pakistan's Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has condemned India's missile strikes on multiple locations in Pakistan-controlled territory, calling them a "cowardly act of war" and declaring that the country is issuing a forceful military response. In a post on X (formerly Twitter), Sharif stated: "Pakistan has every right to respond forcefully to this act of war imposed by India, and a forceful response is being given." The Indian strikes, which occurred as part of "Operation Sindoos," reportedly targeted five sites in Pakistan-administered regions. Pakistan has claimed civilian casualties, while India has maintained that its strikes were focused, measured, and aimed only at terror infrastructure. Sharif emphasized that the "entire nation" stands with the armed forces and said Pakistan's response will be resolute and united. "The entire nation stands with our armed forces on how to deal with the enemy," he said. In a sign of mounting tension, Sharif has also convened a meeting of the National Security Committee (NSC) in Islamabad. According to Geo TV, citing Information Minister Attaullah Tarar, the high-level meeting is scheduled for 10 am local time to assess the situation and determine Pakistan's next course of action. The NSC meeting will likely involve top military, intelligence, and civilian leadership and could set the tone for Pakistan's diplomatic and strategic posture in response to the Indian operation. Earlier in the day, Pakistan's military confirmed that Indian missiles struck locations including Kotli, Muzaffarabad, and Bahawalpur, prompting a nationwide alert. Pakistan claims it has responded militarily while keeping its airspace and forces on high alert. Meanwhile, India has said its operations were non-escalatory and avoided any civilian or military Pakistani facilities, underscoring what it called a "restrained and calibrated" response to the recent deadly terror attack in Pahalgam, Jammu and Kashmir.

Operation Sindoos: Rajasthan Seals Pakistan Border, Punjab Police Cancels Leaves Amid Tension

Operation Sindoos has placed states along the India-Pakistan border, especially Rajasthan and Punjab, in a heightened state of alert following India's precise missile strikes in Pakistan and Pakistan-Occupied Kashmir in retaliation for the recent Pahalgam terror incident. Security personnel have put in place stringent security procedures in anticipation of any potential escalation from the Pakistani side. Rajasthan has blocked the whole 1,037-kilometer section of its international border with Pakistan. Personnel of the Border Security Force (BSF) have been directed to shoot at the first sign of any suspicious movement. The Indian Air Force is still on high alert, and combat preparedness is raised throughout the area. Due to Indian fighter jets regularly monitoring and patrolling the airspace, flight operations from Jodhpur, Kishangarh, and Bikaner airports have been halted until May 9 in

the western sector. As part of the strategic reaction, missile defence systems have also been activated along the border. The Indian Air Force's Sukhoi-30 MKI planes are conducting continuous air patrols covering the region from Sri Ganganagar in Rajasthan to the Rann of Kutch in Gujarat. With the closure of schools in districts like Bikaner, Sri Ganganagar, Jaisalmer, and Barmer, civilian life has also been affected. In these districts, ongoing exams have been rescheduled. As a precaution, police and railroad employees' leaves have been cancelled in certain regions. Plans for evacuation in the event of an emergency have been made, and villages near the international border have been placed on high alert. In order to combat any airborne threats, anti-drone equipment have been placed close to the border. Blackout orders from midnight to four in the morning have also been issued by authorities in



Jaisalmer and Jodhpur in an effort to impede enemy aircraft's ability to navigate and target at high speeds. Police in Punjab, a bordering state, have also been put on high alert. Public gatherings have been restricted, and all police officer leaves have been cancelled. Due to the growing tensions on the western border, Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann has cancelled all planned government events. The severity of the current situation is reflected in the multifaceted security measures, as border states continue to exercise vigilance in the face of possible Pakistani reprisals.

Uttarakhand Chopper Crash: Pilot & 5 Others Killed, 1 Injured



Six people have been killed in a chopper crash in the Gangani area of Uttarakhand on Thursday. The helicopter was on its way to Yamunotri Dham at around 8.50 am when it plunged

into a deep gorge. The chopper was operated by a private company. "The helicopter, bearing registration number VT-OXF, was carrying seven individuals, including the pilot, identified as Captain Robin Singh, and six passengers. It was coming from Yamunotri Dham. Upon receiving the alert, teams from the State

Disaster Response," Manoj Aswal, in charge of Maneri police station said. The Force (SDRF) and local police arrived at the site and started search and rescue operation, Aswal added. He claimed that the chopper was found in a gorge approximately 200 to 250 meters deep. One person has been injured in the incident and has been air lifted for treatment to AIIMS Rishikesh. On the helicopter crash in Uttarkashi district, Uttarakhand CM Pushkar Singh Dhami says, "SDRF and district administration teams have immediately reached the spot for relief and rescue work. I have instructed the administration to provide all possible help to the injured and investigate the accident."

History Created: 2 Female Officers Lead Indian Briefing!

Generally, the Media briefing that is done on behalf of the Indian Army is primarily done by male representatives and army chief. But this time around India has created history by deploying two of its finest female officers from the Army to brief the nation about the operation that was carried out last night. The briefing was primarily headed by Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri as he said Pakistan has



been known to willfully mislead the world and international forums, such as the Financial Action Task Force. The Sajid Mir case, in which this terrorist was declared dead and then, in response to international pressure, brought back to life, found alive and arrested, is the most glaring

example. The latest attack in Pahalgam has understandably generated deep anger in Jammu and Kashmir and in other parts of India. On the other hand, one of the female officers who was presented in front of the Media for briefing, Col. Sofiya Qureshi presented videos showing destroyed terror




